NURSE EDUCATOR MSN

UCF's online Nurse Educator MSN program prepares nurses to teach in undergraduate nursing and/or health professions programs at colleges and universities, healthcare agencies, and/or in the community.

The demand for nurse educators continues to increase. According to the American Association of College of Nursing, faculty shortages at nursing schools across the nation are limiting student capacity at a time when the demand for nurses continues to grow.

UCF's online MSN program provides foundational knowledge for application in the online Ph.D. in Nursing program.

LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT MSN

UCF's online Leadership and Management MSN program prepares emerging and experienced nurse leaders for advanced leadership roles by developing independent expertise in critical analysis and evidence-based evaluation of complex problems at the organization and system level.

Curriculum emphasizes evidenced-based management and patient-care practices to achieve quality outcomes, innovation in the integration of healthcare services, and expertise in leading collaboration interprofessional teams for the novice and seasoned nurse leader.

1. REQUEST OFFICAL TRANSCRIPTS

2. BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING DEGREE

The BSN must be earned from a regionally accredited institution and the nursing program must also be accredited by the CCNE or ACEN. Nurses with a bachelor's degree in a field other than nursing are eligible to apply for the MSN program but must complete 9 credit hours of prerequisite courses in addition to their MSN plan of study.

4. FLORIDA RN LICENSE

A Florida license is required for all students who will be taking clinical and practice coursework in Florida's healthcare agencies and institutes.

4. WRITTEN ESSAY

Address the following in 500 words or less, double-spaced using 1-inch margins and 12-pt. Times New Roman font:

Describe your future career plans and how the program to which you are applying will help you achieve your career goals; Describe the changes you would make in your personal and professional life to ensure success in your graduate nursing education; and identify one significant contemporary issue or problem in the U.S. healthcare and explore how members of the nursing profession can help address that issue or solve that problem.

5. CURRICULUM VITAE

CV must reflect prior education, recent clinical accomplishment, any recent scholarly work (publications and presentations) awards, additional certifications, and activities with professional organizations. For recent graduate, this can include accomplishments as a student.
